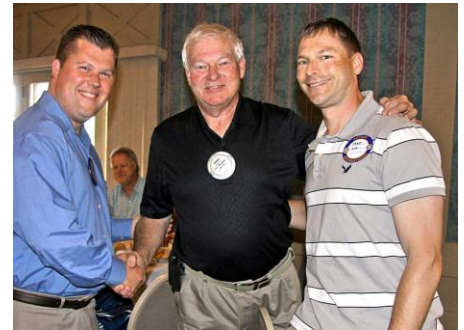

DENNIS LEE was the lucky winner of a 'Rotary cheese-grater,' to be delivered at a later date, compliments of Isaac Grover. Dennis' guest was son Matt, who was visiting Hudson along with his wife, Kacie and their children. The couple -- he a U.S. Army infantry officer and she, an attack helicopter pilot -- are both attached to Ft. Hood in Texas but currently deployed to South Korea.



JULIE THEISEN, an alcohol and drug abuse counselor with St. Croix Co., spoke about the escalating use of alcohol and illegal drugs. Theisen worked 11 years as a transplant specialist nurse with the U of Minnesota before earning a master's degree in addiction studies. She divides her time between counseling people with substance abuse problems and initiating prevention efforts. She noted that excessive alcohol use in St. Croix Co. costs more than \$105 million annually. Taxpayers chip in \$44.3 million to pay for healthcare, lost productivity and other costs such as motor vehicle crashes and court costs. St. Croix's incidence of deaths related to alcohol and drug overdose was more than two times the national average last year, she said.

A youth risk behavior survey completed anonymously in 2014 by local 9th-12th graders indicates 58 percent believe drugs are a problem here and 11 percent had been offered or used drugs or alcohol while at school. One-quarter of all high school seniors admitted they'd experimented with binge drinking -- consuming 5 or more drinks at one sitting.

Theisen said prevention efforts are also focused on raising awareness among adults that they're liable for criminal and civil action if they host underage parties.

The County is teaming with other agencies to produce and distribute a resource guide that will provide information about crisis intervention options, insurance advice, descriptions of resources available and more. For more information, reach Theisen at julie.theisen@co.saintcroix.wi.us.
