Ben Eichman, the invasive species technician for St. Croix County provided an overview of what knotweed is and why it is a problem. Rotarians and others then went to work cutting down the hollow-stem plant that grows up to 13 feet tall. Giant knotweed and its relative, Japanese knotweed, were brought to the United States a few decades ago as ornamental landscape plants.

The program featured Susan Nygaard, manager of community health improvement for Allina Health. Nygaard, from Lino Lakes, a registered- and public health nurse, focused on Allina's new 'Change to Chill' initiative aimed at educating youth and adults about stress and how to ease it in their lives.

While some stress is good and helps improve performance levels, today's youth often don't realize it can result in upset stomach, difficulty breathing, headache, chest- and muscle pain, trouble concentrating and sleeping, and it can affect appetite.

Other manifestations for teenagers include emotional issues, cheating to try and achieve, eating disorders, disruptive behavior and even suicide.

The web site aims to educate through videos, a quiz, a photo contest and advice on activities, lifestyle changes and how to use "mindfulness" to mitigate the negative effects stress can cause. Nygaard encouraged members to visit www.chilltochange.org, take the quiz and learn more about the topic
