July 23 program



Last week's program was August Hoffmann of Hudson who teaches psychology at Metro State University in the Twin Cities. He recently wrote a book titled "Philosophical Foundation of Evolutionary Psychology."

His contention is that people should be taught to be involved in their community – giving back. He brought several of his students with him to the meeting and told about their efforts to "give back" by planting gardens, maintaining the gardens and donating the food to food shelters. He said volunteerism promotes "pro-social" behavior.

"If you look at the 'anti-social' individuals who cause problems, they tend to be loners," Hoffmann said. "There is something to be said for working together and collaboration. There is a mind-body relationship." He also said volunteer opportunities are decreasing in many ways because of social media and people spending time online (and alone) – he called it an "environmental deficit disorder."

"Isolation is very damaging and leads to trouble," Hoffmann said.
